100 Men In Suits "Together, We Mean Business"

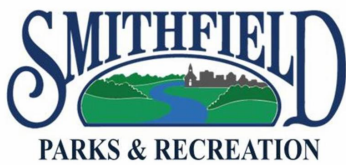
We were looking for 100 Men in Suits but, instead, over 200 Men and young gentlemen participated in the rally in Downtown Smithfield on June 27th.

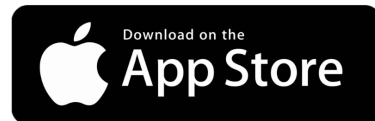
