



Smithfield Public Utilities Wins Two American Public Power Association Awards

The Town of Smithfield Public Utilities Department has earned the American

Public Power Association's (APPA) Safety Award of Excellence for safe operating practices in 2020. Smithfield earned first place in the category for utilities with less than 15,000 workerhours of annual worker exposure.

Additionally, with a score of 99 out of a possible 100 points, the Town of Smithfield was designated a "Diamond" utility by the APPA, which is a grade up from the previous "Platinum" designation




in 2018 and "Gold" designation in 2015. This grade exemplifies the Smithfield Electric Division's continuous search to improve itself in its safety, reliability, system improvement, and workforce development.

Pictured above, from left to right, are Mayor Andy Moore, Electric Line Technician TJ Harper, and Public Utilities Director Ted Credle.


COVID-19 Vaccination & Testing Sites

Vaccinations will be administered on a first come, first serve basis until our capacity of




